LOCAL RULES:

Out of Bounds (Rule 18.2)

- All estate boundary fence/walls. Beyond all white stakes, including estate roads.
- During play of the 4th Hole, the area on the left of the hole, defined by white stakes, is out of bounds. These stakes are treated as boundary objects during the play of 4th Hole. For all other holes, they are immovable obstructions.
- A ball coming to rest in private property is deemed to be a lost ball. You may NOT retrieve it. Please respect our resident's privacy.

Penalty Areas (Rule 17)

- Yellow Penalty Areas and Red Penalty Areas are identified by stakes and are defined by yellow and red lines respectively. In the absence of lines, the stakes and the natural boundaries of the penalty areas define the penalty area.

Abnormal Course Conditions

(including Immovable Obstructions) (Rule 16)

- As defined in the rules of golf and any areas ringed in white or marked GUR.
- All flower beds that are marked with a blue stake are no play zones and must be treated as an abnormal course condition.
- The sandy areas with plants, vegetation, and rocks at hole 11 is part of the general area of the course and will not be considered a bunker.
- Protection of Young Trees. Young trees that are identified by a white tag or are under 2 club lengths in height are no play zones must be treated as an abnormal course condition. Relief is also extended to the basin of a young tree.
- Relief from Electric Boundary Fence. If a player's ball lies on the course and within two club lengths of the electric boundary fence on holes 4 and 5, he or she may, without penalty, take relief under Rule 16.1, using as the reference point the point that is two club lengths from the fence and an equal distance from the hole.

Methods for Stopping and Resuming Play (Rule 5.7)

A suspension of play for a Dangerous Situation will be signalled by one long siren, and players must discontinue play immediately.

Resumption of play will be signalled by two long sirens. See Rule 5.7b.

Second 9 holes – 2 hrs and 15 min

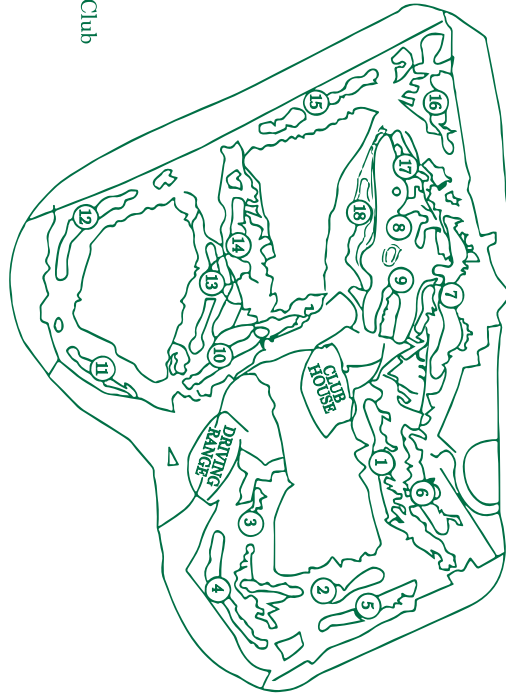
Halfway house – maximum of 15 min
