Dear Members and Residents,

It is incredible to be halfway through the year, and with the snow falling the heart of winter has arrived.

As predicted winter is a little quieter, but this allows us to get projects done in preparation for the upcoming summer.

The kitchen project is well underway with very few challenges with the construction, which is always welcome for any job of this level. Once completed the kitchen will have a larger area to effectively manage the operation, with both restaurant and banqueting. In addition, we will have increased and improved storage facilities, laundry, and a staff canteen. The completion of the project is expected in the middle of August 2023.

In conjunction with the kitchen project, the F&B team are currently working on a summer offering with exciting new menu items, beverages, look and feel.

The deck area alongside the play area has had its cover put up, which has already made a great improvement to the area. The next phase is the furniture which we are very excited about and we believe this will transform this area, just in time for summer.

At the AGM I referred to the quality of water in our irrigation dam, and the work that has been done has improved the quality. The next phase is to install the water fountains, which are envisioned to improve the oxygen levels, with the added benefit of improving the aesthetics, both in the day and in the evening with the LED lights. The six fountains will be installed by the middle of July.

Behind the 6th green and alongside the bridge, we have had a considerable amount of erosion, and so therefore we have decided to stabilize the area with gabions. This project is critical to be done in the winter when the river is at its lowest, as it takes about two months to complete. The 4th hole in particular, the back tee box will be going through renovation, in terms of being lowered, as well as in addition the new trees being planted for the protection of golfers and homeowners.

The driving range will also have trees added to add aesthetics and protection for homeowners surrounding the range. On the driving range you will see the addition of signage, and these not only confirm the daily distances, but highlight the maximum distance that each golfer is permitted to hit their golf ball, and we thank everyone for adhering to the rules. This project will commence on Monday the 17th of July 2023.

We are very pleased to announce we have been selected to be the host of the Junior IPT 2023, which is to be played from the 17th – 22nd of December 2023. This event brings the country's best junior golfers from each Province, and one we are very excited to host. During the tournament, the golf course will be closed for play. As we get near the event we will communicate additional details.



FROM OUR GREENKEEPER

Levelling sprinklers on fairways and rough at the 1st, 6th, 7th, and 16th.

After all the river damages we had in the past few months I've realised immediately that the sprinklers at the above-mentioned holes need attention. It needs to be lifted higher and levelled with the surface.

The reason why sprinklers were so low, was because of the silt piling up after each flood we had in the last two to three years. With the sprinkler levels not on standard it caused sprinklers to miss areas on the fairways and rough and not working properly. So, I had to do something immediately to improve our watering coverage on the grass and helping with less breakdowns.

We decided to start rising these sprinklers during the winter months of 2023.



The process of raising low sprinkler heads on fairways and rough is straight forward in theory.

We began by removing the turf surrounding the sprinkler to expose the underlying soil. Using smaller trenching shovels, we dig all around the sprinkler to expose the entire sprinkler and "swing joint" which in most cases are of total plastic design.

These two facets form the vertical portion and the connection to the deeper water lines running horizontally under the fairways or rough. These swing joints are designed to be able to move a few inches up or down to adjust exact depth. Once enough of the swing joint is exposed, we can simply lift the sprinkler up to the appropriate height.

Using a piece of 2" x 4" wood to ensure the top of the sprinkler sits even with surface level, we pack the soil from the hole around the sprinkler. Adding a few inches of soil at a time and tamping to compact provides a firm base underneath the sprinkler to make sure it does not sink to its' original grade.



Once all the soil is compacted back around the sprinkler, the turf that was first removed is put back into place and lightly tamped to level. The squares where the turf was cut will be visible for a few weeks as they heal back together slowly.



PHELAN GOLF ACADEMY

In this month's article we will be continuing with our basics check and focusing on stance.

A golfer's stance is one of the most overlooked golf basic but it is imperative that your stance compliments your individual golf swing and the type of shot you wish to execute. How wide or narrow you stand can have a great effect on your ball striking, overall balance and athleticism of your dynamic motion. Generally we want our feet to be as wide as our shoulders, this is the baseline of having a solid foundation that will improve your clubhead speed, golf swing pressure shift from one foot to another and maintain balance throughout the golf swing.

For shorter shots, because we aren't trying to generate much clubhead speed but we are instead trying to have a controlled golf swing to help us hit the ball a certain distance, it is advisable to have a slightly narrower stance. Standing too wide can also cause restrictions in our hip range of motion.

Older golfers would benefit from having their toes slightly flared out to assist them with a better hip rotation and range of motion as their hips have gathered mileage and general wear and tear over the years.

Younger golfers with too much mobility will benefit from having their trail foot slightly "toed-in" to somewhat restrict their turn in the backswing. I do however advocate for always having your front foot "toed-out" as this assist us in hitting through the ball and finishing in balance over our front foot at the completion of the golf swing.

Here's a drill you can use to find your natural stance width:

- Walk a few steps forward like you normally do.
- As you step forward and ground your front foot, stop and rotate both feet 90 degrees to the right.
- Without moving your feet, get into your golf posture and now you have your own perfect stance width.

This drill works perfectly because as we walk, it is our brain's priority to make sure we don't fall over. Your brain tells your body exactly how far you should stride to maintain your individual balance. This is the same balance you will need to swing efficiently and in balance.
